School staff, pupils and families... join us this St David's Day by doing your own little act of Welshness, and sharing it on social media.

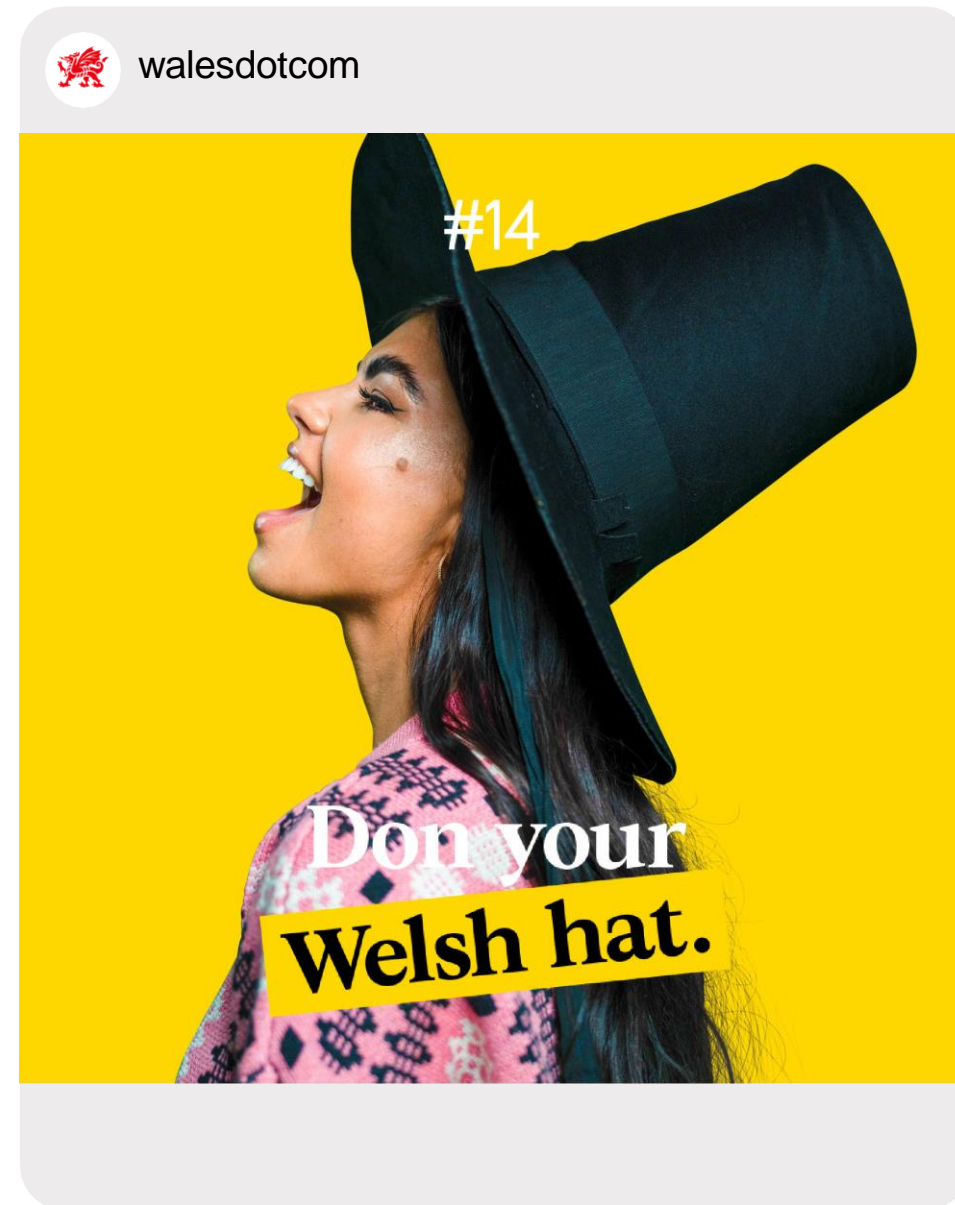
What makes an act of Welshness?

We'll be showcasing dozens of these acts in the run up to 01 March to inspire people.



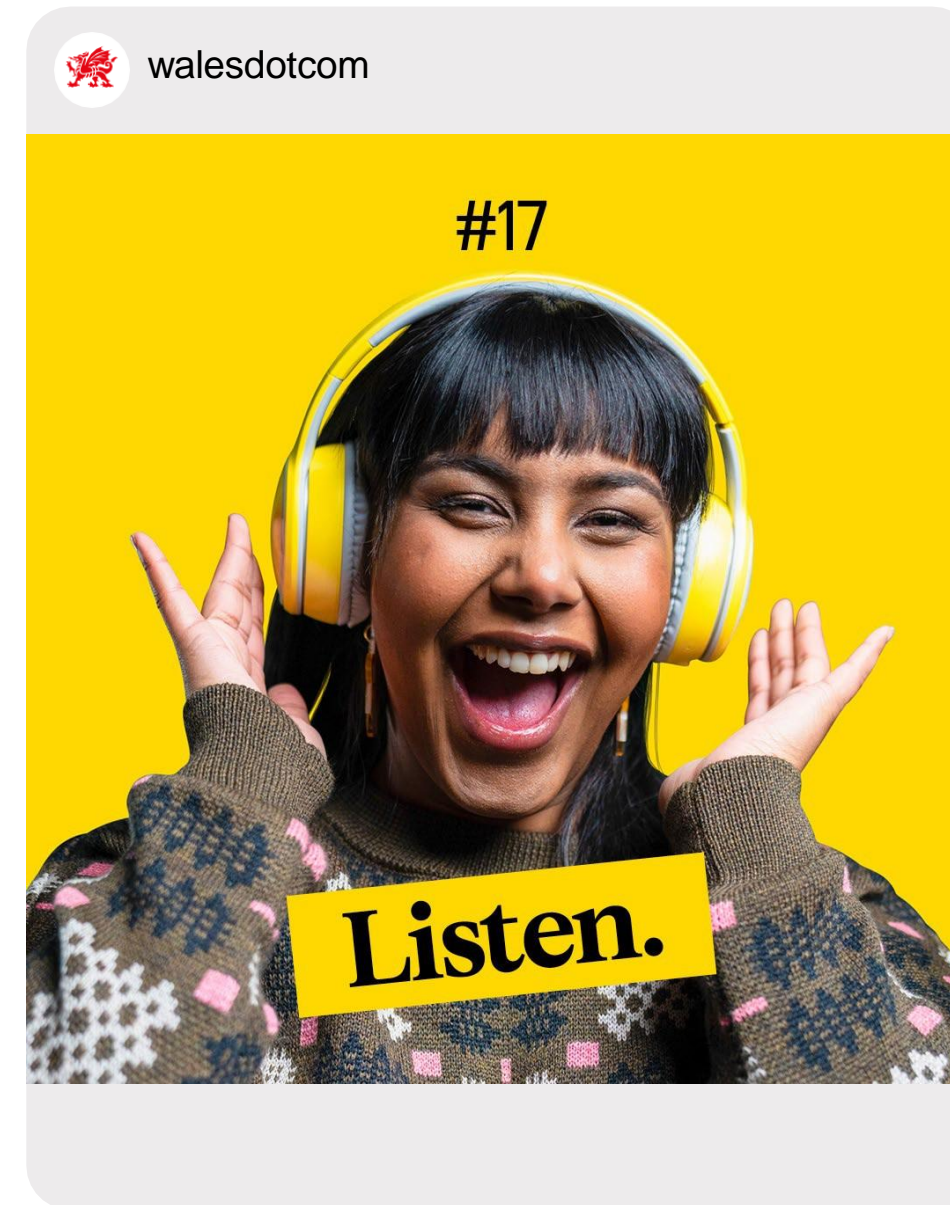
Some random acts to get you inspired...

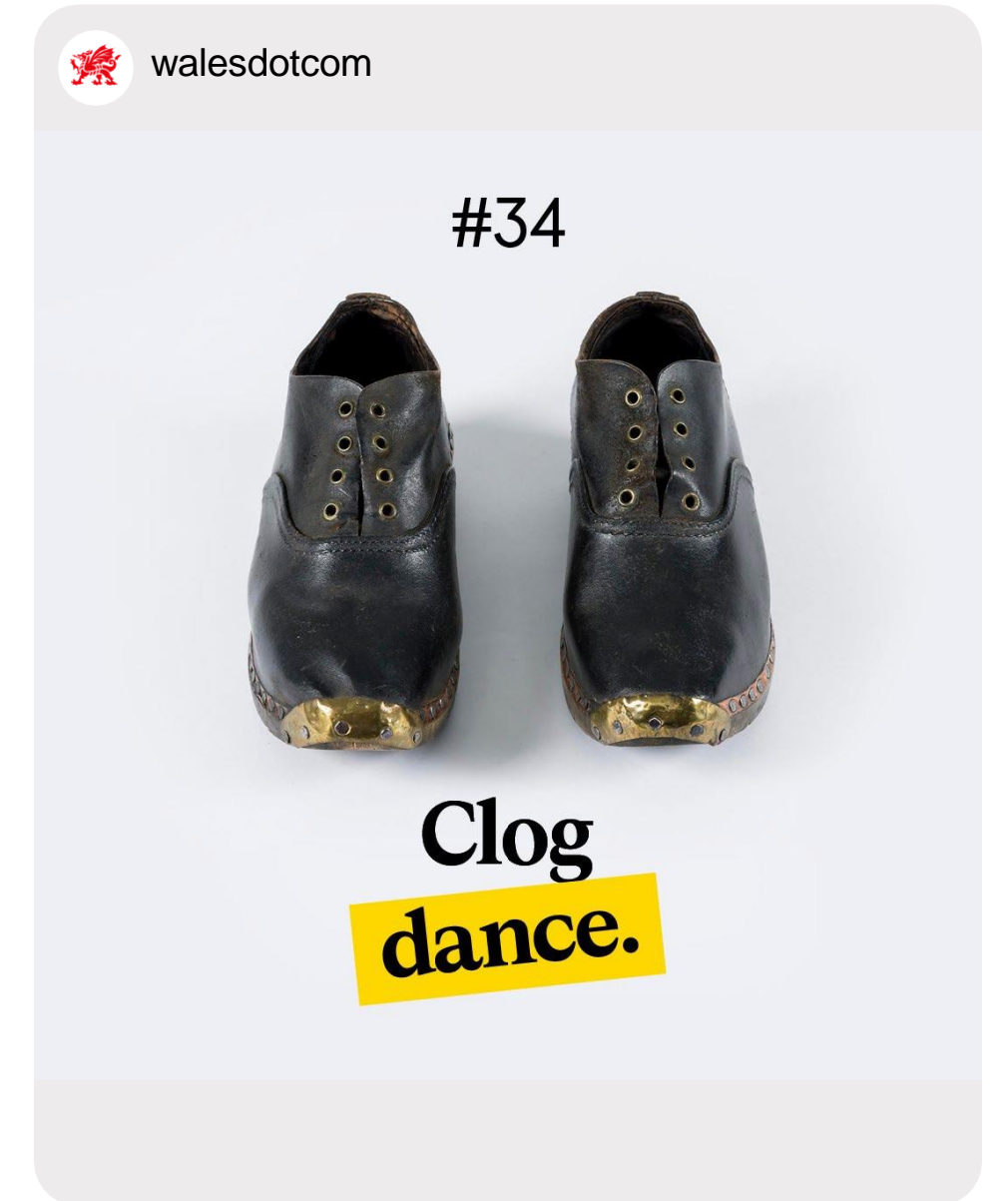
Share Welsh Cakes

Sing it solo, belt it out with friends or blast it on a random instrument. Extra points for learning the second and third verse!



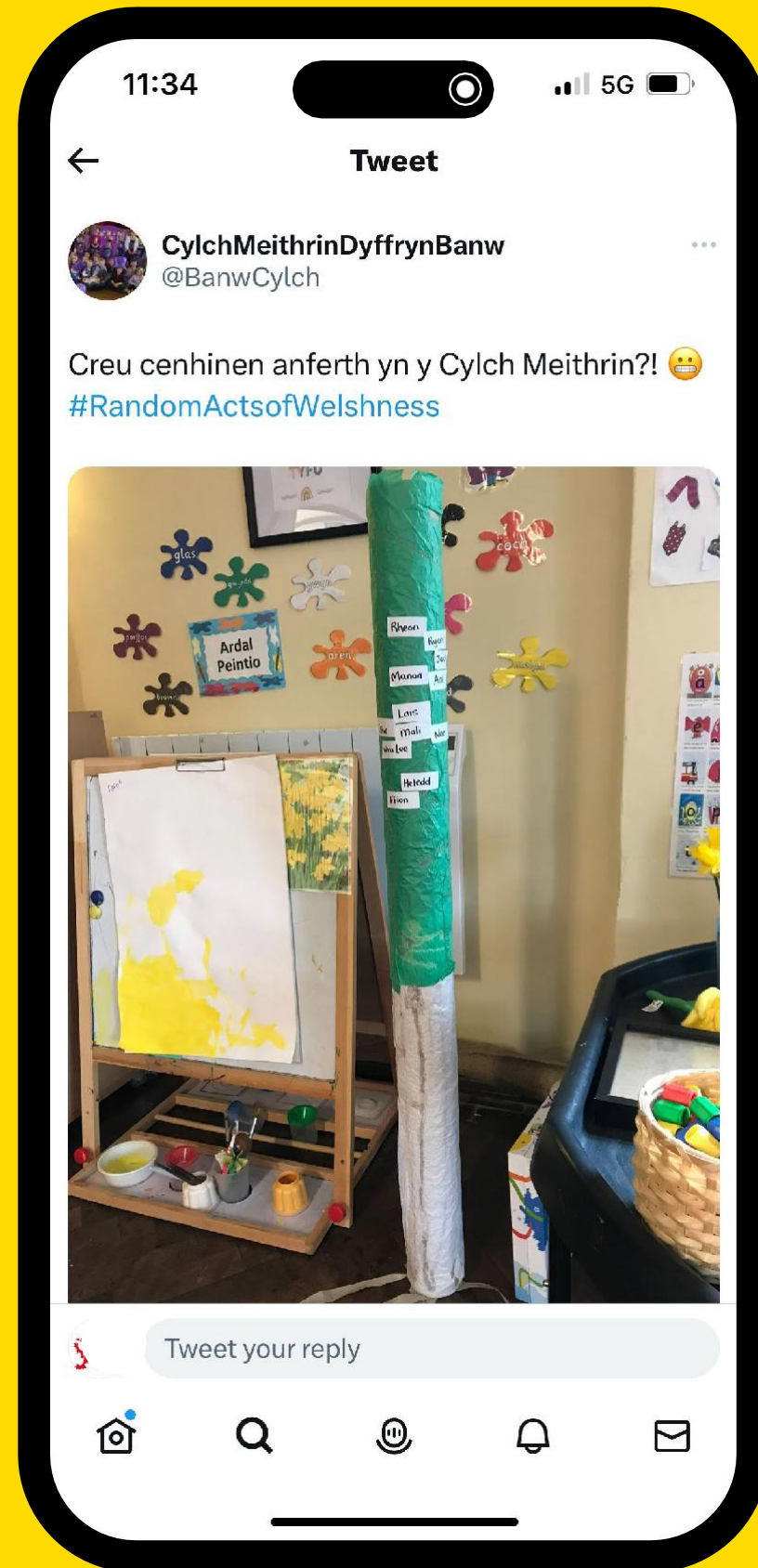
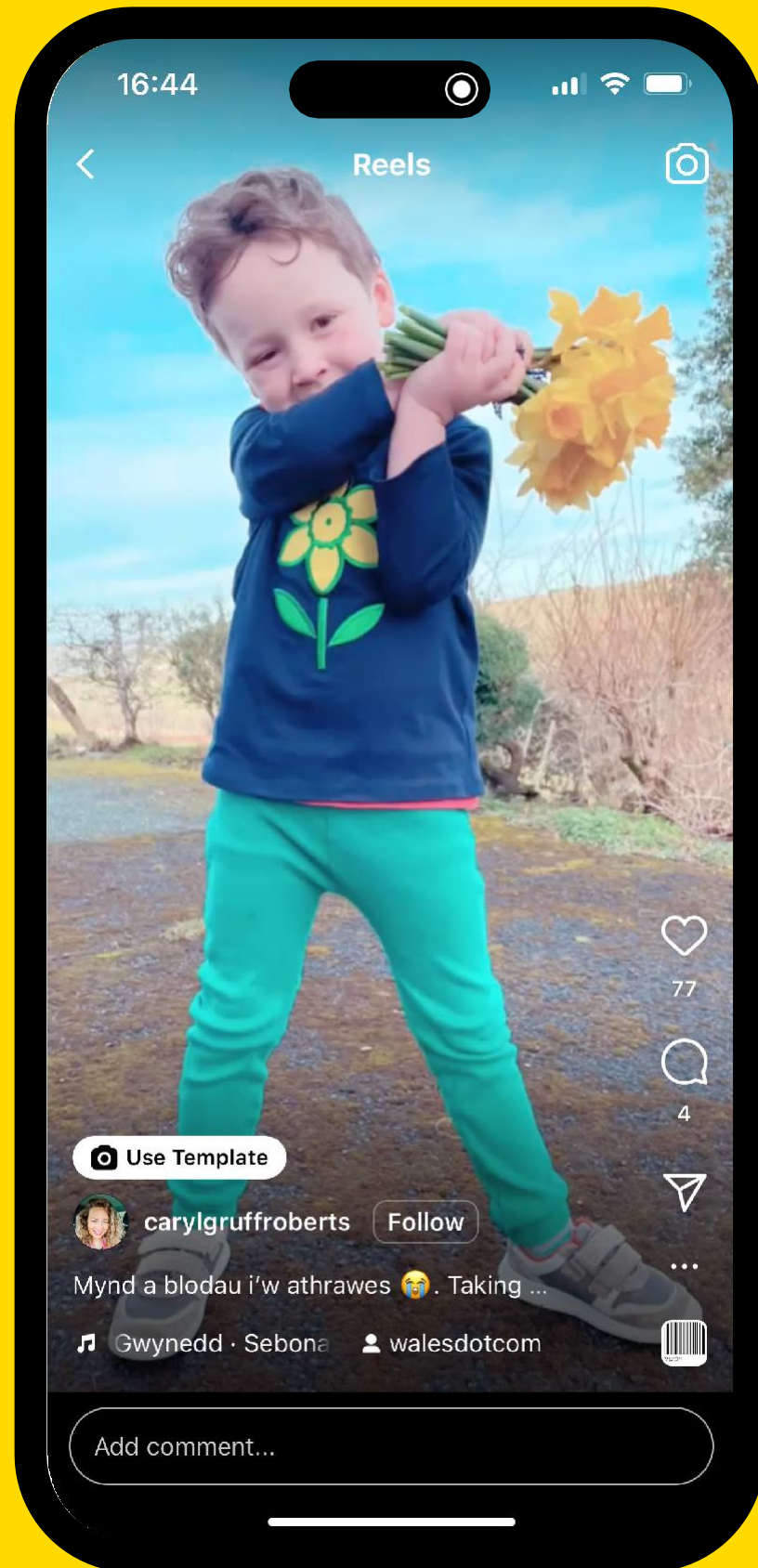
Make your hat
